CONTENT/STANDARDS:

During the course of the year students will be engaged in units of study that are outlined in the California History-Social Science Content Standards and The California Common CORE Standards.

Grading

Academic Grading: Students earn academic grades based on a percentage of the accumulated points. Every assignment will be worth a certain amount of points and are subjected to the following grading scale:

Citizenship Grading: Students earn citizenship grades based on the SOAR rubric found on page H of the Student Planner. Please review this policy with your student.

Reading and participating: Sometimes your student may be assigned reading as homework. This is to help support the lesson/activity being

addressed the next day. Your student's reading completion will be assessed through participation points following a reading assignment.

GRADING SCALE 90-100 A 80-89 B 70-79 C 60-69 D 59 and below F Grades are calculated based on points. There are no weighted categories.

Classroom Expectations

Students earn citizenship grades based on several factors, including:

- 1. Classroom behavior (remember to bring all needed materials daily).
- 2. Cooperation with other students and teachers (Expect to be in your seat, ready to work before the bell rings).
- 3. Attendance (truancies, tardiness, and number of absences).
- 4. Adherence to expectations for appropriate class responsibilities, homework, and obligations (such as meeting deadlines, silence when others have permission to speak).
- 5. Class participation (working, speaking, and listening).

Citizenship can be lowered due to: behavioral issues, being off-task, distracting others, talking out of turn, and not listening or not paying attention. Eating, drinking, gum, candy, snacks and any electronic devices are not allowed in class.

History Notebooks

Students will keep most of their work in a history notebook. Notebooks will be graded every one to two weeks. Once graded, students receive a progress report showing the students grade on the newly graded assignments. Students then have two school days to complete or improve those assignments. Late assignments receive a ten percent penalty. Late work will not be accepted after the two day window.

Homework Policies and Expectations

Teachers assign meaningful homework that is expected to be completed with quality and on time. Assignments posted in the classroom are to be copied into students' planners and can be found on Standley's website www.sandiegounified.org/schools/standley. Students will be encouraged to list the names and phone numbers of "study buddies" who may assist with missing assignments. If a student has an <u>excused absence</u>, they have as many days as they were absent to make up the missed work. **The student is responsible for getting any missed assignments from the teacher.** ASSIGNMENTS STARTED IN CLASS AND NOT FINISHED IN CLASS, BECOME HOMEWORK.
